

Suggested Four Year Course of Study for the International Baccalaureate Diploma Program

<u>Freshman Year</u>

<u>Junior Year</u>

<u>Senior Year</u>

IB Diploma Candidates are required to test in 6 areas, with at least 3 three subject exams at the Higher Level. Language A English and History are both required at the Higher Level, and students will choose one more from the list below. Additional requirements of the IB Diploma include Theory of Knowledge courses, CAS (Creativity, Activity, Service) experiences, and the Extended Essay.

Courses offered at the **Higher Level**: Language A English (required), History (required), Biology, Chemistry, Psychology, Language B (French or Spanish), and Art.

Courses offered at the **Standard Level**: Math A & I (required), Biology, Chemistry, Environmental Systems & Societies, Psychology, World Religion, Anthropology, Language B (French, Spanish, Russian), and Art. The Foreign Language requirement can be fulfilled with a two-year course of study called Ab Initio (the current option for this is Russian).

Testing fees of \$35.70 per exam apply. Please research potential credits awarded for IB exams results by searching the name of the institution and "IB credits".

NC students who finish at the top of their class are always IB Diploma students. A student entering senior year with a 4.0 GPA, but who had never taken Advanced or Honors courses, generally ranks around 90th in the class.
